
Through a program of exhibitions that began in 2021 at Gio Ponti's villa L'Ange Volant near Paris, the non-profit organisation Genius Loci seeks to revive the spirit of emblematic and little-known architectural creations. Founder and curator Marion Vignal explains her approach, based on making the architectural work both the setting and the subject of each exhibition.

Goethe liked to think of architecture as "petrified music," with the stones of a structure playing a silent melody, its lines and volumes beating out a secret rhythm. Presenting an architectural work as the subject and setting for an exhibition could consist of plumbing its mysteries to reveal its innermost identity, reviving its harmonies to make them sing anew. Genius Loci's program is the result of my curatorial reflections on the form and challenges of the exhibition as a narrative medium and an emotional journey, born of the desire to create a dialogue among artistic disciplines with the architecture as the main protagonist. To bring the site to life, to power it, to "perform" it, the public is invited to explore a *mise en abyme* of its spirit and history through interactions with other works and artistic practices. The exhibition thus becomes a way to experience the space, interspersed with dialogues and encounters. Sounds, fragrances, sculptures, paintings, drawings, furniture creations, videos and

performances unite in a veritable orchestra of singular musicians and instruments, joining together, often for the first time, to accompany the viewer's experience to the rhythm of the architecture.

Understanding an architectural work requires an awareness of the space, its context and its unique qualities. To accomplish this, it is essential to follow the protocol defined by its creator and to guide the visitor step by step through this gradual, intimate exploration of the site. Le Corbusier conceived "architectural walks" punctuated with surprises, sometimes even putting the visitor in danger on a steep ocean liner-style staircase or atop a dizzying height. Gio Ponti saw architecture as a series of tableaux, whereas Antti Lovag was obsessed with disorientation, the multiplication of viewpoints and perspectives. Inviting the public to experience a structure means, first of all, laying out a narrative, sensory path that captures the site's "intention" and identity as closely as possible.







Visitors can then be drawn into the physical being of As the creations join together, the exhibition becomes the place, giving them a sense of the theoretical princiwhom, as Mies van der Rohe would have it, sought to translate their era into space.

The site that they thus discover is not inert or frozen in the past, but transcended by the presence of a painting, a sculpture or an object that takes its place in the space like a performer. The works on display play their own score, blending their music with that of the structure.




